Overview

With Trump's One Big Beautiful Bill signed into law, there's been a lot of discussion—and confusion—about what “FEOC” is, and how it will impact the US solar industry. What is FEOC?

The One Big Beautiful Bill Act (OBBBA), signed J, would extend foreign entity of concern (FEOC) restrictions, previously limited to the section 30D clean vehicle credit in the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA), to six additional clean energy tax credits: The IRA applied FEOC restrictions to. The OBBB's enactment dramatically shifts the landscape for renewables and energy transition investments. What is FEOC?

FEOC is an acronym meaning “Foreign Entity of Concern” and is the DC way of saying companies that have ties to North. By disqualifying projects or companies that do not meet the new criteria, the rules in the House Ways and Means Committee's proposed budget potentially could sideline clean energy initiatives already in development from receiving credits. The foreign entity of concern (FEOC) rule denies the federal investment tax credit to projects that use too many Chinese components and prevents U.

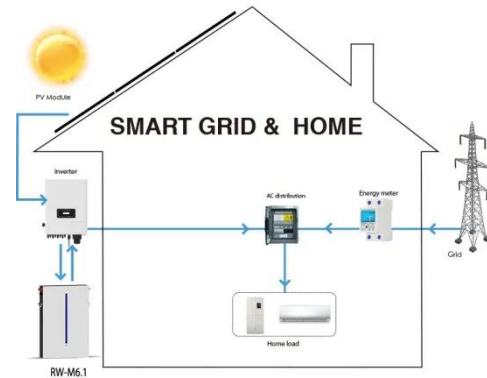

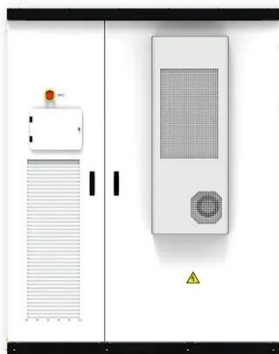
